



Clydebank Crematorium Environmental Policy Statement

Clydebank Crematorium (West Dunbartonshire Council) Complies and operates within the present environmental legislation and policies .We are pro-active and where possible use sustainable and biodegradable products and sustainable methods as outlined below:

- 1. All Emissions from the cremation process comply with PG5/2, AQ1, and OSPER convention annex 11. SE.P.A. being the regularity authority, (permit No. PCP/B/1009184, Variation Permit 2016)*
- 2. National Burden Sharing Scheme (CAMEO, No. 62) for Pollution Prevention emissions monitoring.*
- 3. Re-cycling of waste heat and exhaust gasses by using a propriety Heat Exchanger unit fitted to the cremators to re-purpose the said heat for the purpose of heating the crematorium*
- 4. The use of Bio-Degradable ash containers for collection of ashes.*
- 5. Re-cycling metal waste residue from the cremation process in accordance with the ICCM metal re-cycling scheme with Orthometals. All fiancés going to a dully selected charity.*
- 6. The economical use of all energy (Gas, Electricity) in a managed manner.*
- 7. The use of low power L.E.D. Lighting with active motion sensors.*

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
